REGISTRATION-PLEASE READ

Our new registration process has been a huge success. Thank you for your patience as we transition. Each person who attends the Coon Rapids Senior Center and registers for activities has an account. This has simplified the registration process and collection of payments. We hope the frequently asked questions below will help with any questions you have.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Question: How do I register?

Answer: Trips and activities can fill up fast, so it's best to call or come in as soon as able. Make sure to talk to someone in person rather than leaving a phone message. Mailed in registrations are not guaranteed.

Question: When is payment due?

Answer: Each activity has a payment deadline which is noted in the Senior Center newsletter "Voice of Experience". If payment is not received, your name will be removed from the activity.

Question: What types of payments are accepted at the Senior Center?

Answer: We currently accept cash, check and credit card payments. Please make checks out to: Coon Rapids Senior Services.

Question: Can I sign up a friend?

Answer: Yes, if you first ask your friend's permission and are able to provide your friend's name, address and phone number. We cannot complete a registration without this information.

Question: Can I pay for a friend?

Answer: Since each person has their own account at the Senior Center, friends should write separate checks. This will ensure credits or refunds are given to the correct payer of the activities in the event a person cannot attend. Spouses should pay with one check, please.

Question: What if I register and pay for an activity but can't attend?

Answer: If you speak with a Senior Center staff person to cancel <u>prior</u> to the payment deadline, we will credit your account to use at a later date, issue a refund by check, or refund your credit card. If you cancel <u>after</u> the payment deadline, you will be responsible for the payment unless someone on the wait list is able to take your place. In that case, you will be issued a credit to your account to use at a later date or a refund by check. Please note: checks may take 2-3 weeks to receive.

Question: If I receive a credit, how long can I have a credit on my account?

Answer: All credits must be used by the end of the year or a refund by check will be issued.
